





PROBLEM









EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE (EBP)...

Ensures clinical decisions and services are well-informed, safe and effective¹

Has positive effect in patient outcome and public confidence²


NURSES RECOGNISE THE IMPORTANCE OF EBP, BUT...

Most clinical nurses lack the confidence and/ or skills to appraise research³

IN GSTT CRITICAL CARE...

Post-graduate ICU course applications require journal critique

40% of applications fail on this requirement












PURPOSE

Evaluate the effectiveness of journal critique workshop

Increase critical care nurses'
confidence and skills in journal
critique

Improve clinical staff's capability in implementing evidence-based practice














METHOD

THE WORKSHOP

- Open to all critical care nursing staff
- Added on to in-house Introduction to Critical Care (ICC) curriculum
- Ad hoc monthly sessions for voluntary attendees













METHOD

EVALUATION

Confidence

Anonymous
 questionnaire with pretest & post-test
 Likert scale (1 to 5)
 rating for
 confidence

Skill

Monitoring of attendees' success in post-grad application requiring

journal critique













RESULTS

In 8 months, there were a total of 46 attendees and response rate to the questionnaire was 70% (n=32)



Confidence

Pre-test mean: 2.5

Post-test mean: 4.2

Paired t-test: p < 0.001



Skill

18 out of 20 nurses passed their post-grad application

Passing rate: 90%











IMPLICATIONS

- Service evaluation results prove workshop's effectiveness in increasing nurses' confidence and skills in critiquing research
- Although not a direct indicator of application of EBP in practice, it is a good first step in involving the nursing workforce in reviewing evidence

NEXT STEPS

- Journal critique workshop is now fully-integrated in our ICC curriculum, which is run every 4 months
- We've now introduced evidence-based practice (EBP) clinics where we offer 1:1 advice on various research-related skills, not just journal critique
