- Upsurge in fighting over 2024
- Primary care mobile clinics Eastern Ukraine conflict area
- Mental health support
- Pre-hospital care training
- Secondary care + Surgical













Turkey / Syria Earthquake

- 14 million affected and over 50,000 dead
- Established integrated facility with:
 - UK EMT, UK Military, Turkey Search and Rescue, Hospital staff
- Mobile clinics into the surrounding area
- Over 17,000 patients seen












Field Hospital set up













Managing Humanitarian responses

- Decision to intervene

• General 'fixit'








Standards and guidelines

- Primary / Trauma referral Field Hospital
 - Primary care + outreach
 - PHC, ED, BEmONC
- Secondary Care Field Hospital
 - 90 beds
 - PHC, ED, IPD, CEMONC, OTx2
- Nasser Hospital Emergency Department
- Reach over 200,000 patients













Field Hospital, Khan Yunis

- Partly tented and partly locally constructed
- Currently providing PHC, ED, MCH, OT, IPD, HDU services
- Frequent mass casualty incidents
- 300 staff national and international
- 500 patients p/day












UK-Med Deployment Register

- 1200 medical and non-medical staff
- UK-Med Register Members are resident in over 80 different countries
- 150+ deployed in the last year











Working in emergency response

- Working alongside national staff
 - Affected by crisis
 - Fatigue
 - Different SOPs, context and culture
